**Supreme Champion Ribbon & Trophy for Most Successful Pavilion Exhibitor.**

**Judging** commences at 9.30am on Saturday.

**Entries** may be delivered to the Showground on Friday January 25<sup>th</sup> between 4pm and 8pm as well as on Saturday January 26<sup>th</sup> between 7.30am and 9.15am.

**Pavilion open** to the public from 11.30am.

1. Exhibitors shall, if required, provide proof as to bona fides of their exhibits and if proved to have knowingly made a false entry will forfeit prizes and be barred from exhibiting again.
2. Judges' decisions and Disputes Committee decisions are final and there is no right of appeal. All protests must be made in writing and delivered to Secretary within 2 hours of judge's notification of award. Protest to be accompanied by a \$10 deposit to be forfeited if the Committee decides the protest is frivolous.
3. The Society accepts no responsibility for the loss of or damage to any exhibit, goods or possessions and, will not be responsible for any accident caused to any exhibit and will not be responsible for any loss of livestock.

## **Pavilion Section F – Photography**

### **Regulations:**

- a) All photographs must have been taken (captured on camera) by the exhibitor.
- b) Photos may be taken on either film or digital cameras and may be digitally printed.
- c) All photos must be mounted on cardboard with a minimum 2cm border surrounding the image.
- d) Prints may be any size or dimension as long as the cardboard mount does not exceed 50cm on its longest side. Remember, wide borders often enhance prints.
- e) Photos mounted behind glass will NOT be accepted.
- f) Any entry previously exhibited at Tarago Show is ineligible.
- g) A maximum of 4 entries per person per class is allowed.
- h) The exhibitor's name and entry class must be clearly printed on the back of the cardboard mount.
- i) Entries not complying with the above instructions may not be displayed.
- j) Junior competitors may enter the unrestricted classes 1 -13.
