News from the Capital Region Area Consultative Committee (CRACC)

AUSTRALIAN FARM SURVEY RESULTS

These results were released by the Australian Bureau of Agricultural and Resource Economics (ABARE) in April 2008. Results show that the financial performance of Australian farms fell sharply in 2006-07 as severe drought across most of southern Australia led to a significant reduction in farm production and incomes.

However, farm financial performance indicators predict:

- increased grain and livestock production, combined with higher commodity prices, are projected to boost farm cash incomes in 2007-08;
- incomes in the wool industry are projected to increase threefold to more than \$93 000 in 2007-08, the highest income recorded in real terms since 1987-88; and
- strong cash flows leading into 2007-08, combined with a recovery in grains receipts, are expected to enable most producers to rebuild livestock numbers and reduce debt.

It happened at Sassafras

It started happening in the 1850s and continues to happen today ... *"the ranges of Sassafras beckoning me"*. This final line from James Henry Sturgiss' poem, Sassafras Mountain hints of the lure of the area for the first settlers of the mid 1850s and still that same magic was there on Saturday, May 10, 2008 when several descendants of those early settlers gathered to reminisce and renew old friendships.

It was an especially auspicious day, being also the 118th year since the Galloping Major (Jim Sturgiss) was born on May 10, 1890. It also happened to be an appropriate day to celebrate a 100 years of the original Sturgiss hut still standing today. It was built in 1908 by Jim's father, Robert Sturgiss who had moved his family to the Sassafras settlement in 1895 to work for the Roberts family.

The 2008 gathering included a few familiar names from the first Sassafras settlement - Alley, Orford, Haughton, Sturgiss. Others who came were connected to early settlers of the wider community between Sassafras and Nerriga, most notably the Rolfes. Probably the strongest family roll up was the Alleys. 84 year old Mildred was in her element, having baked the large celebration fruit cake that she and Ruth Leahy cut to mark the occasion.

Elva Gale, a direct descendant of the Dunnes who owned the Nerriga Pub in the early 1900s was a strong supporter of the main organizer of the day, Ruth Leahy, nee Sturgiss and present owner of the historic hut.

Other Sturgiss descendants present were Elza and Denzil as well as Ruth's daughter, Christine. Kevin Smith of Nerriga, one of the oldest there, was spritely and upright and ready for a yarn or two.

Rex Hockey lived up to his well earned reputation of bush poet of some repute as he entertained everyone with several rousing recitations including one or two JH Sturgiss originals while a most pleasant country bush musical background was provided by Ron McLaughlin. Pam and Lester Walters were also a tremendous support to the day's success.

Once again a little bit of history unfolded out at Sassafras along the old Wool Road from Nerriga to Nowra and we were drawn to reflect on the final verse of James Henry Sturgiss' poem, Sassafras Mountain

*"And though rugged and wild is this red ranges roof,
Still beauty presides there, eternal aloof,
And wherever night finds me, in peace or in strife,
Under destiny's wings, on the ranges of life,
Through the mists of my slumbers, in dreams I shall see,*

The ranges of Sassafras beckoning me."

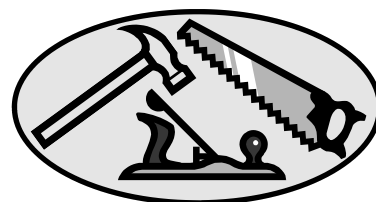

THE ORIGINS OF THE ADHESIVE POSTAGE STAMP

Rowland Hill invented the adhesive postage stamp. Before the use of adhesive paper stamps, letters were hand stamped or postmarked with ink. Postmarks were the invention of Henry Bishop and were at first called 'Bishop mark' after the inventor. Bishop marks were first used in 1661 at the London General Post Office. They marked the day and month the letter was mailed

The Penny Black

1 May marks the introduction in 1840 of the world's first adhesive postage stamp: the Penny Black. The Penny Black was the brainchild of Rowland Hill, a Victorian social reformer and teacher.

Hill dreamed of improving life for the masses and believed that if more people could afford to send letters, then general literacy levels would rise. In the 1830s the costs of postage were very high, with charges imposed for the number of sheets sent and also for distance travelled.

In 1839 Hill was commissioned to restructure the system to encourage greater usage. Hill's system, which he developed alongside assistant Henry Cole, was unlike any that had preceded it and still exists today.

Under Hill's scheme people paid by the weight of a package, whilst sending a letter would cost no more than a penny. For the first time an adhesive stamp would be used to indicate pre-payment of postage. Hill and Cole went in search of a design for their new stamp but, after a failed competition that yielded 2,600 unsuitable entries, they finally settled on a sketch drawn by Cole himself.



Cole's idea was for a stamp bearing the profile of the reigning monarch, Queen Victoria. His model set a precedent, for to this day the reigning monarch appears on all British stamps.

The Penny Black went out of use after just a year, as it was found that a red cancellation stamp across its black background was hard to see.

Rowland Hill, father of the postage stamp, died in August 1879. He was buried in Westminster Abbey in London - a great honour and a fitting recognition of his work.

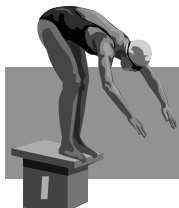
